DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO



The Democratic Republic of Congo is listed as one of the deadliest countries for children, with over 850,000 children forced to flee their homes because of active conflict¹. This mass relocation has left families food insecure, leading to severe acute malnutrition in many of the little ones most affected by the crisis.

This year, we partnered with a clinic in the Democratic Republic of Congo to begin a Malnutrition Feeding program. Because of Saving Moses, the clinic will be providing therapeutic milk and therapeutic porridge to malnourished babies and toddlers, giving them a chance at life.

ANGOLA

Baby Ida is only 18-months old. She is less than half the healthy weight of a child her age. She is her single mother's eighth child, but one of only three living. Malnutrition is a terrible disease that has plagued her family.

Thankfully, Ida's mother got her to the Saving Moses clinic in her area in time. She told us, "I had lost hope that my daughter would survive, but after intensive treatment for five days she was able to sit again. She started to get her appetite back, which then improved her strength. A week later she was able to leave her bed alone and would play with the other children on the patio at the clinic. I thank God for healing my daughter. The milk has saved my child's life."

SAVING BABIES FROM THE SEX INDUSTRY EVERY DAY



CAMBODIA

NightCare provides loving shelter and care to the babies of sex workers overnight when they are most vulnerable to abuse, neglect, and exploitation.

Rith is 18-months old. His mom works at night and she doesn't know who his father is. When she goes to work at night, she leaves Rith with a neighbor. The problem is, when he gets home in the mornings, Rith is usually sick, like he hasn't slept, and he has new bruises and scrapes. She doesn't think he is being taken care of by the neighbor, but what else can Rith's mom do? She doesn't want her clients meeting him and potentially harming him.

This is why we have NightCare. Rith's mom learned about NightCare from a coworker. She started bringing him at night, where he gets good food, a bath, clean clothes, love and attention, and a safe place to sleep. He is overall healthier and happier since he has been coming, and his mom says she no longer worries about him at night.

BANGLADESH

When Neeru was still a child herself, her family member told her she was going away to work in a factory, when in fact she had been sold to a brothel. Now that she has a daughter of her own, she is so thankful for the NightCare center near work.

"My daughter is growing properly in NightCare. She never has to meet my customers because of NightCare. She is being protected from different types of drugs. I am so happy she can sleep safely in the night." – Neeru

We opened a new NightCare center in Bangladesh at the end of 2017, and now, a year later, it is growing and flourishing.

AFGHANISTAN



30-year-old Hunoon has six children, ranging in age from three months to ten years. When she was young, her family escaped the Taliban regime by immigrating to another country. She has since returned to her home village. Between the running and the Taliban's restrictions on women, Hunoon has not been educated, including in proper childcare.

She came into a community center supported by Saving Moses with her baby. The baby was sick because she stopped breastfeeding him at two months and started feeding him sugary cookies and crackers—an idea she heard from another community member. The education she is receiving from the community center means that her baby has a chance to grow up healthy.

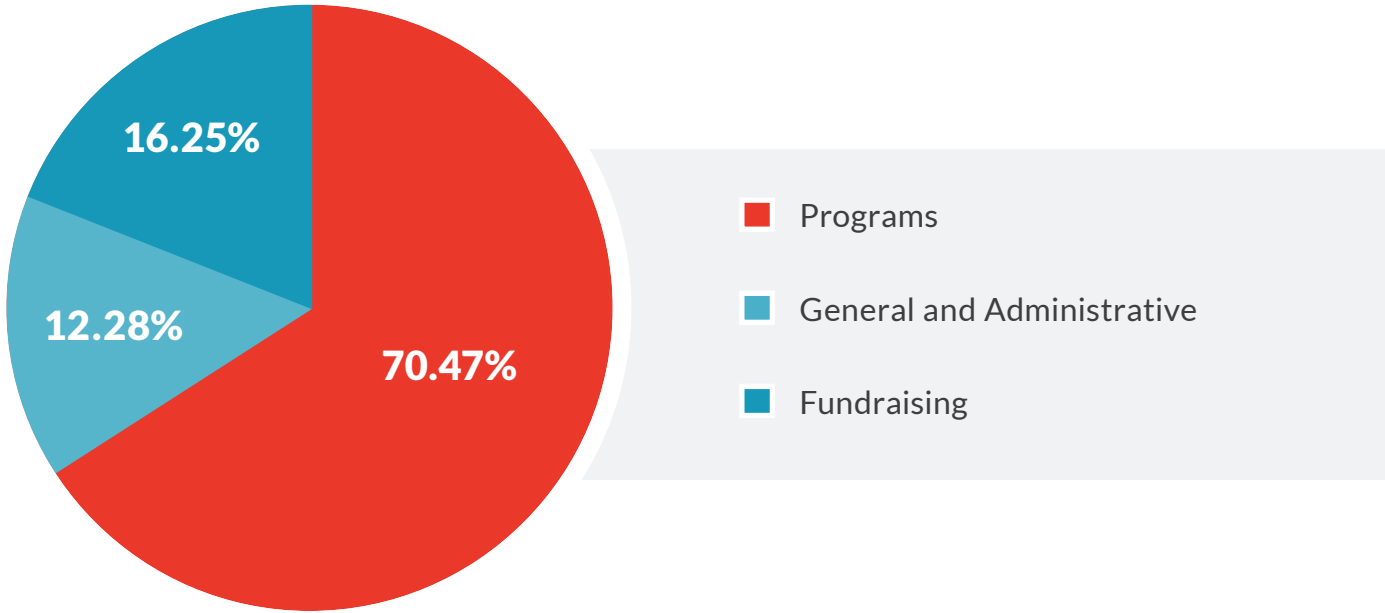

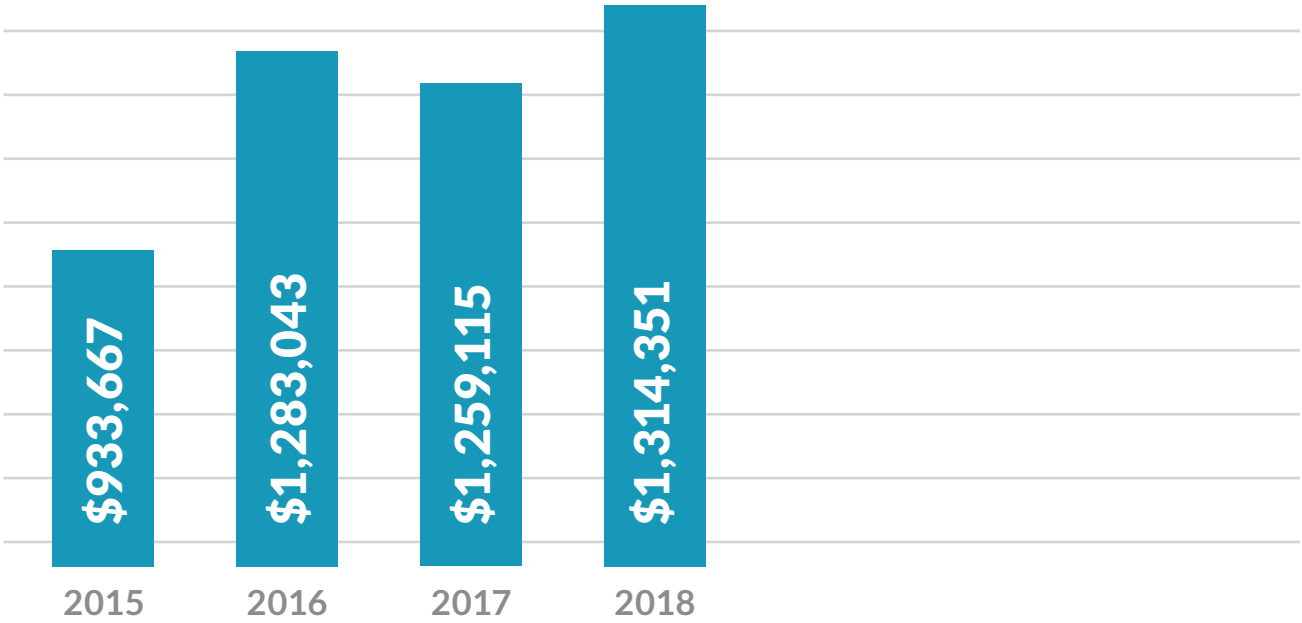
