Our Mission:


Saving Moses is a global humanitarian organization saving babies (ages 0-5) every day where help is most needed but least available.

This year we celebrate our 10th birthday as an organization. From humble beginnings to where we are now—we have witnessed growth at every level. We are so excited for the next ten years!

Saving Moses becomes its own charity and opens its first program in Angola—working to save babies from malnutrition.

Opened 2nd and 3rd NightCare Centers in Cambodia.

- Fourth NightCare opens in Cambodia.
- Provided vital medical support to babies trapped by war in Syria.



Malnutrition program in the Democratic Republic of Congo begins. The beginning of NightCare in Cambodia! Babies are saved from the sex industry!

Flexed our programs to meet babies' emerging needs during the pandemic. BirthAid begins in Afghanistan. Babies and mothers have safe births in the war-torn areas!

- BirthAid starts in Angola and the DRC, helping babies make it past the first 28 days!
- Second NightCare Center in India opens.
- Pivoted Malnutrition program in Angola to reach moderately malnourished babies before becoming severe.
- First NightCare opens in Bangladesh. Fifth NightCare opens in Cambodia.
- Provided nutritional support for 4,000 Rohingya refugee babies fleeing violence in Myanmmar.

BirthAid: Babies are born safely!

We provide community-based education and birth support in high-conflict areas and rural Sub-Saharan Africa. In these areas, the neonatal mortality rate is high due to a lack of information on safe birth practices or access to any healthcare whatsoever.

The most vulnerable time in a person's life is the first 28 days after birth. According to UNICEF and the WHO, most child deaths occur within this short timeframe.

The majority of these deaths are concentrated in rural Sub-Saharan Africa and in conflict zones. With appropriate care, most are preventable.

KEY TERMS Neonat

Neonatal mortality:

The number of newborns who die within the first 28 days, out of every 1,000 live births.


Thousands of babies die every single day. Most would be alive if they were born in a different part of the world. If nothing changes, 30 million babies will die by 2030.

BirthAid in Conflict Zones

In war zones, nobody fights fair.

Women and children are not just civilian casualties but are often specifically targeted by combatants. Hospitals and aid workers are often direct targets as well. Imagine what this is like for women giving birth.

We have heard their stories:

- The mothers who flee to the hospital under the cover of night to deliver their babies in a safer environment.
- The women who give birth on the run from militias.
- The newborns who die because there is no care to treat their specialized needs.

Conflict and war unmake the world. It upends all forms of stability and leaves nothing but chaos in its wake. Doctors and skilled birth attendants are forced to flee for their safety, and women and newborn babies are left with no one to take care of them before, during and after birth.

So what can we do?

We work in key areas of conflict around the world:

Afghanistan • The Democratic Republic of Congo • Syria (concluded in 2021)

According to experts, two main interventions can significantly prevent newborn mortality during birth: sanitary conditions and understanding common warning signs. In Afghanistan, we provide essential birth training in rural and war-torn villages. This increases awareness and understanding of safe birth practices and prepares local community members to help deliver babies safely.

We train communities on everything from taking care of pregnant women to lifesaving interventions for babies who are not breathing after birth. We work within cultures to overcome barriers to ensure that every baby in these regions has a future.

Opened in 2022!

In the Democratic Republic of Congo, we work with a pediatrician who operates an antenatal (the first moments before birth) clinic in an unstable region of the DRC. This region saw recent militia fighting, which led many to flee the area. However, as some stability returns, we are planning to open a clinic that will provide vital services where there are none.

An Unprecedented Year in Afghanistan—the Taliban Takeover

In 2021, the United States pulled out of Afghanistan after 20 years of war. The chaos that ensued was unprecedented. Tens of thousands of Afghans tried to flee their country, afraid of the impending Taliban

takeover. It was a time of shock around the world, and we felt deeply for the Afghan population, who feared their future.

Uncertainty regarding the future of our program, BirthAid, remained on the forefront of our minds as well. Several of the expatriates working in Afghanistan on BirthAid were evacuated, and the Taliban took over the areas where we




worked. Fortunately, our ground team was able to continue serving at-risk mothers and babies despite the takeover.

The program went underground, and we even had to cease some of our operations altogether for a time, but today the BirthAid training program is operational and needed more than ever!

The Taliban has limited access to healthcare for women, so free programs such as these are answers to prayer for so many.

BirthAid training can be compared to CPR or First

Aid. These vital skills and knowledge are often the difference between life and death for newborns and mothers. Despite limited healthcare options, BirthAid ensures communities are given the tools they need to provide safe and healthy birth environments.



BirthAid in Rural Sub-Saharan Africa

In 2021, Sarah and Heidi visited rural Sub-Saharan Africa to learn why newborns in these regions die at disproportionate rates. The situation is complex, and there are multiple geographic and geopolitical factors at play. Despite the obstacles, we are committed to doing all we can to save as many babies as possible.

Mothers often distrust the quality and care of the healthcare systems they have available to them and choose to give birth at home.

Healthcare systems are not equipped to handle complications.

- Lack of sufficient or appropriate equipment.
- Poorly trained staff.

During complications in pregnancy, women or newborns are referred to city hospitals.

- A hospital or city could be hours away
- Roads are often poorly maintained and difficult to navigate.
- Babies and mothers regularly pass away in transit.

What We Provide:

Opened in 2022! Our first rural Sub-Saharan Africa BirthAid program in Angola.

The BirthAid program in Angola provides support at every level to eliminate barriers to healthcare for expectant mothers and newborns.

- We work at the community level to build trust with hospital systems and provide basic training on healthy births.
- We work at the local clinic level to provide essential equipment and training.
- We work at the hospital level, where our in-country doctor trains hospital personnel on proper protocols to ensure the best outcomes.

In 2022, we have a goal of providing 2 safe births in Angola!



BirthAid

When Matthias and Eveline learned they were having a baby, they were overjoyed. They carefully made plans to bring a new little life into the world. It would be the couple's first baby. The baby was born, and everything seemed normal. They were a family!

A few days after birth, the baby had some problems breathing. Matthias and Eveline brought the baby to the local clinic for help. The clinic was not equipped to handle their new baby's needs, and sadly, the son they had just brought into the world passed away.

Situations like this happen all the time across Sub-Saharan Africa as rural clinics are not equipped to handle complications during or shortly after birth. This means that thousands of newborns die from preventable causes every day. If they had access to proper care, they would survive.

Saving Moses is committed to changing this recurring narrative. We are working to ensure newborns live past the first 28 days and have the best chance to thrive in life!

Eveline and Sarah. The pain of losing a baby never goes away. You learn to manage it, but the death of a child forever marks your soul. It is a grief you cannot escape.








We administer specially formulated F-75 and F-100 therapeutic milk to treat babies with Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) and who are at risk of starvation.

Severe acute malnutrition occurs when a baby does not have the proper nutrients for survival. It is a progressive disease and often involves several comorbidities. Severe acute malnutrition is evidenced by very low birth weight (so low you can see the bones poking through the skin), edema (protruding tummy storing up water to try to survive), peeling skin and yellow hair. If it is not treated, it is fatal.

Severe acute malnutrition needs to be treated at a clinic where doctors can administer specially formulated therapeutic foods and treat each child with care. This can cause a strain on families who need to leave other children at home or at their workplace to stay the required 4–6 weeks to treat their baby.



Fast Fact:

Half of the deaths of children under five years of age are from malnutrition. In 2022, after speaking with our ground staff, *Saving Moses* is adopting a more comprehensive, community-based model.




- We will treat moderate acute malnutrition at the community level before it becomes severe.
- Moderate malnutrition can be treated with a therapeutic food called Plumpy'Nut[®], a ready-to-use therapeutic food (RUTF) that doesn't need to be administered in a hospital.
- Treating moderate cases before they become severe will alleviate the comorbidities that often come with severe malnutrition, making it easier to treat.
- Families will be able to stay in their villages and treat their babies in an outpatient setting.

We will continue our treatment of severe cases at the hospital level. The community-based model will address the problem more strategically by treating malnutrition at every level.

ALBERTO'S STORY:

When malnutrition sets in, it is scary. It takes the lives of thousands of babies and toddlers every day. Severe malnutrition forces parents to come to terms with the fact that they may lose their baby. Mothers watch as their babies cling to life, as their chest heaves up and down trying to catch a breath, as their eyes stair listlessly in front of them, unable to focus, as their bones poke through their skin. Can you imagine how you would feel if you saw your child in this state?

Alberto's family thought he was in his last days.

They thought it was the end. But fortunately,
where there is life, there is hope. Alberto
received specially formulated F-75 therapeutic milk to treat
his malnourishment. He slowly began gaining weight and
getting stronger. He graduated to the F-100 formula, and he
continued to improve. He improved so much that we successfully
discharged him from the clinic as a healthy boy. Our Malnutrition
feeding program saves lives every day!

What's Ahead in 2022:

On the precipice of the worst drought in decades, communities in Angola are bracing for impact. We experience drought here in the west, but it doesn't have the same life and death consequences as it does for those in other parts of the world. For Angolans, drought means their farms and livelihoods suffer critical losses, rendering them unable to feed their families. *Saving Moses* is diligently observing the ever-changing situation to ensure we respond to the increased needs resulting from the drought.

We provide loving shelter and care for the children (ages 0–5) of sex workers when they are most vulnerable to abuse, neglect and exploitation.

Giving Babies and Toddlers a Safe Place to Sleep

If you volunteer at a NightCare center in Cambodia, Bangladesh or India, you will see babies and toddlers getting dropped off at night by their mothers or caretakers. They will run into the center, excited and with giant smiles on their faces—like they own the place. A nanny will take them by the hand, give them a bath and clean their clothes. They will comb their hair, and if they are a girl, they will braid it or put it in pigtails. They will sit down and receive a specially prepared meal or bottle. After that, it's time to play! Young toddlers will grab a large truck and run around the center—laughing and giggling. Babies will sit on the floor with a rattle or hear a story read to them by the nannies.

NightCare provides a safe and loving environment for children otherwise left in unsafe places.

Then something magical happens—the chaos subsides, and they all come together and sit in a circle. These nannies are incredible at their jobs! They sing songs and read stories to help the kids settle down before bedtime. Then, each one curls up in a warm, soft bed where they sleep soundly and safely through the night.

If you did not know where these children came from, you would think they were healthy and playful like any ordinary child, but they live in an environment that is overrun with abuse and corruption. They are born and raised in the sex industry.

Many of them would be abused or neglected while their mother works into the night, with no one to take care of them. NightCare has changed all of this for over 400 children by providing a safe, joyful, healing space away from the dangers of the sex industry. They now get to have a safe environment to play the way kids should!

A Healing-From-Trauma Based Approach

Coming from the abusive streets of brothels, the babies and toddlers in our centers have experienced terrible trauma.

Many are not able to voice this with their words, but their actions demonstrate the hurt they have faced. Behaving aggressively, staring listlessly into space or being unable to soothe themselves are all telltale signs of trauma.

Trauma causes children to live in a constant state of fight or flight because they have been taught by their environment that they are not safe.

Fortunately, they can heal from trauma—especially at an early age. NightCare brings not only safety from further danger but also offers healing as well. Once a child knows that they are safe, they will have the freedom to let their guard down and be a kid—exactly what they are supposed to do.


Nannies tenderly work on establishing healthy attachments with the babies and toddlers at our centers while providing for their physical needs. They know that if a child is "acting out," it is most likely because of the hurt they have faced. Instead of punitive discipline, they lovingly redirect their behavior.

Our Regional NightCare Director, Matt, commented that children he once saw

being violent with others are now getting along. For possibly the first time in their lives, babies at our India NightCare center slept soundly as they listened to a lullaby.

We believe that unconditional love is a powerful force. We offer love as abundantly and freely as we can because we know that love transforms lives.

DIDI'S STORY:

Didi* works in one of the largest brothels in Asia. She was sold into the sex trade by a family member at a young age and has been stuck ever since. With the money she made from sex work, she would support her family—until she had a son, Sai*. When her son was born, she stopped supporting her family financially to take care of her newborn boy. She wanted to make sure that, despite his environment, he had everything he needed.

Growing up in the sex industry is dangerous, and mothers need to take extreme measures to make sure their babies are safe. Inside the brothel community, there is imminent danger at every turn. Growing up in the industry herself, Didi knew this reality well. She knew the risk of abuse her son faced living within the brothel walls. She would scrounge up all the money she could to pay for nannies to ensure his protection while she worked. This left her with little to live on. Rent is expensive. Food is expensive.

Life is expensive. Didi knew that the path she was on was not sustainable. Enter NightCare.

NightCare revolutionized Didi's and Sai's lives. It gave her not only a safe place to take her son while she works, away from the dangers of the sex industry, but it also gave him a place to grow and thrive. Sai now attends NightCare regularly, where he is protected, loved and nurtured. Didi may still be trapped in the sex industry (once women are in this industry, societal barriers make it very hard to leave), but Sai can have the childhood he deserves at NightCare.

What's ahead in 2022:

We are expanding in India! Our center there has grown so much that we are reaching capacity and need to open a second center. There is so much need in India for NightCare, so this is just the beginning! Even as we anticipate the opening of a second location, we are making preparations for our third and fourth locations as well.




