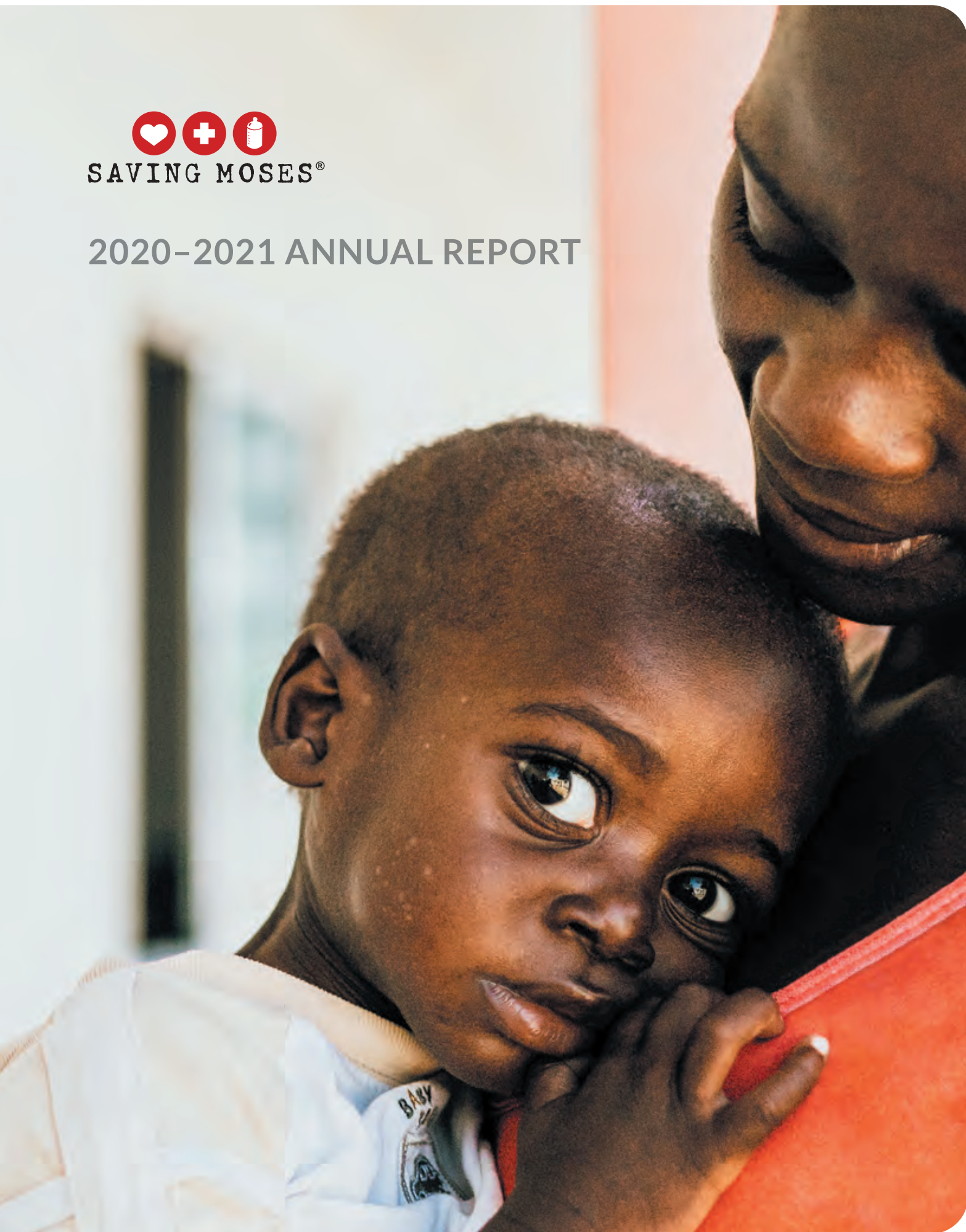

Thank you so much for your interest in ***Saving Moses!*** As I think back over 2020, it was a year of immense challenges and accomplishments. The COVID-19 pandemic affected our daily living in the countries where we live, but the impact on our babies and toddlers who live in impoverished countries was monumental.

Just like the developed nations where we live, we experienced these lockdowns in the countries where ***Saving Moses*** works. Consequently, we adapted our programs to meet the immediate survival needs of our babies and toddlers. This means we distributed CareBoxes with food and hygiene supplies and followed up with our moms to learn about the ongoing needs of their babies. Over the course of the year, we did these things in cadence with our normal **Malnutrition**, **NightCare** and **BirthAid** efforts. It was so encouraging to me to watch our teams in each country pivot to respond and adapt to the survival needs of our toddlers and babies!

I'm deeply grateful to our teams on the ground who work daily to save babies. Thank you so much to our heroes and allies, along with our magnificent U.S. team, who embody our core values. The consistency of our ground teams, our headquarters office and our donors together works to save babies every day. We save babies every day.

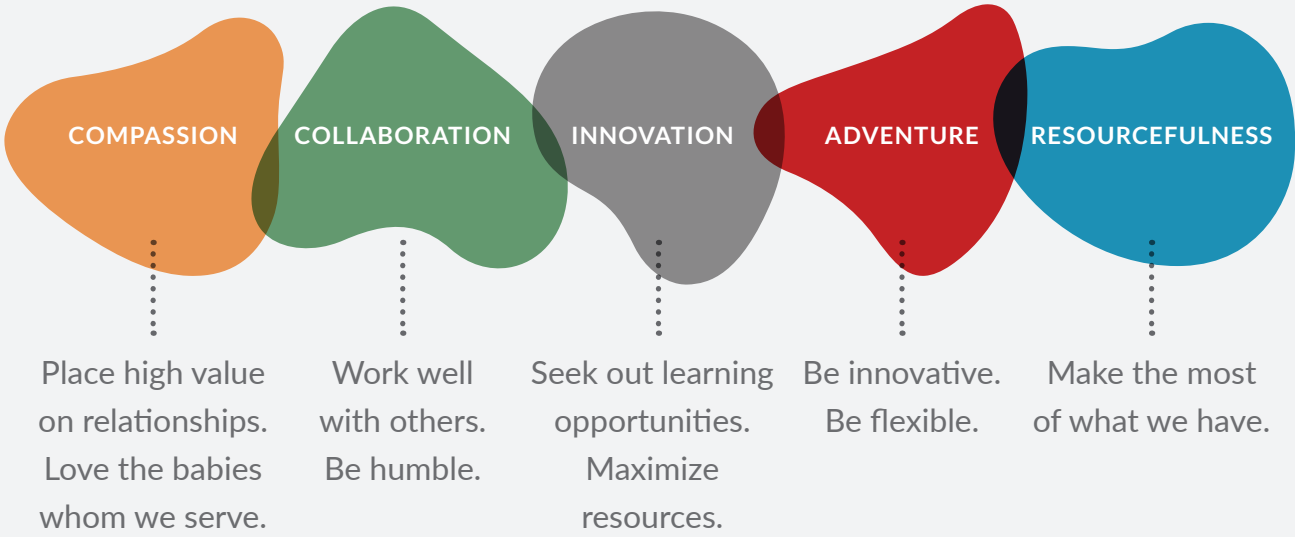
Our Mission:

To establish lifesaving programs in areas where the infant and neonatal mortality rates are the highest in the world and to protect babies most at risk to the sex industry in low-income countries.

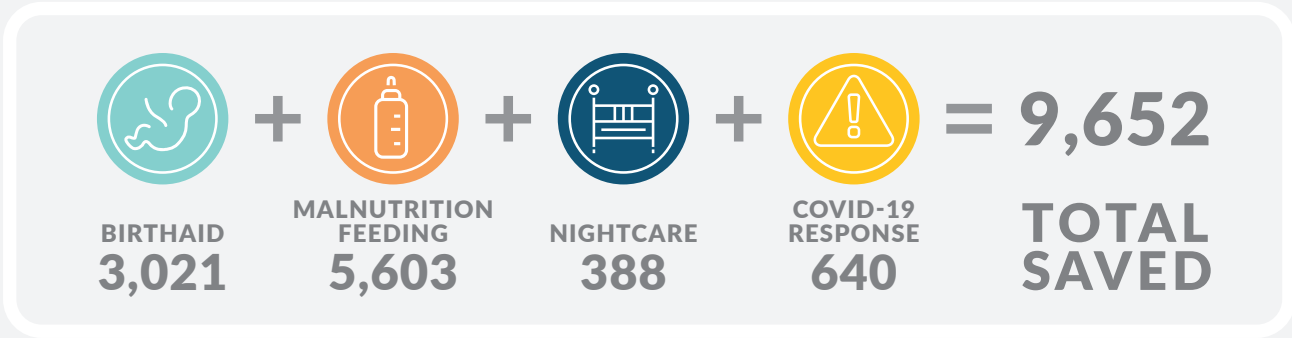

BirthAid: Babies are born safely!

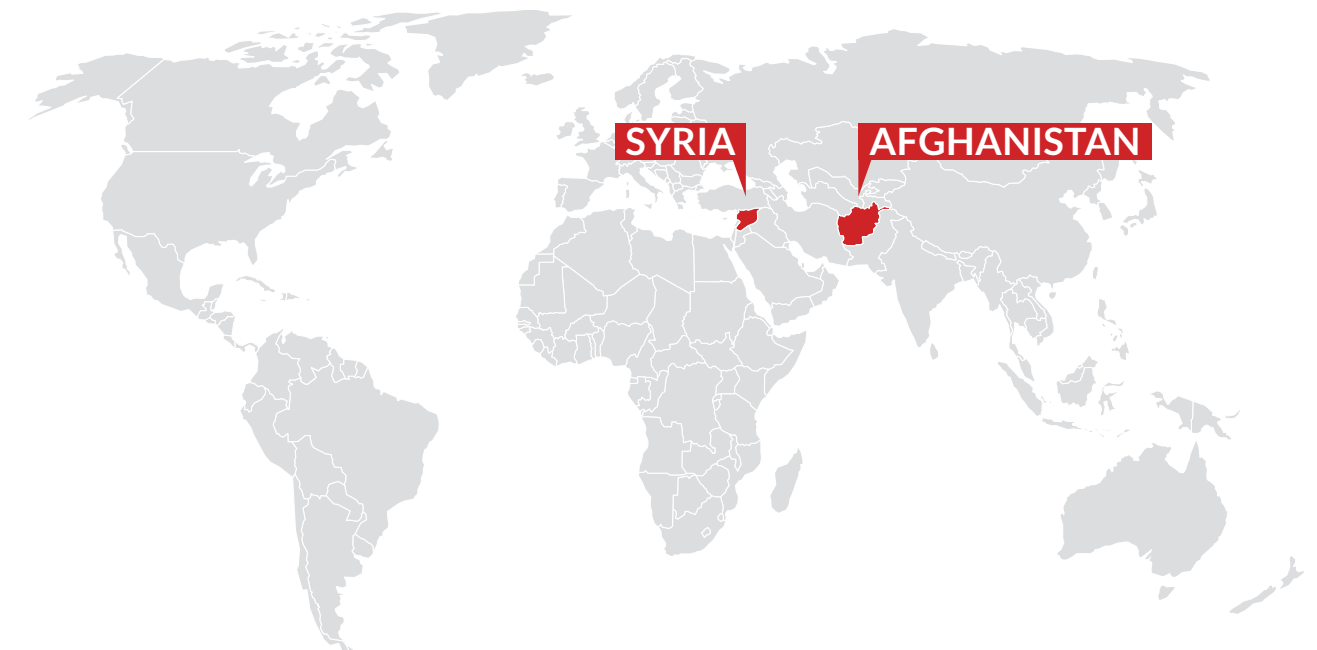


We provide community-based education and skilled birth attendants in high-conflict areas where the neonatal mortality rate is high due to low healthcare access or lack of information on safe birth practices.

Newborn babies need our help!

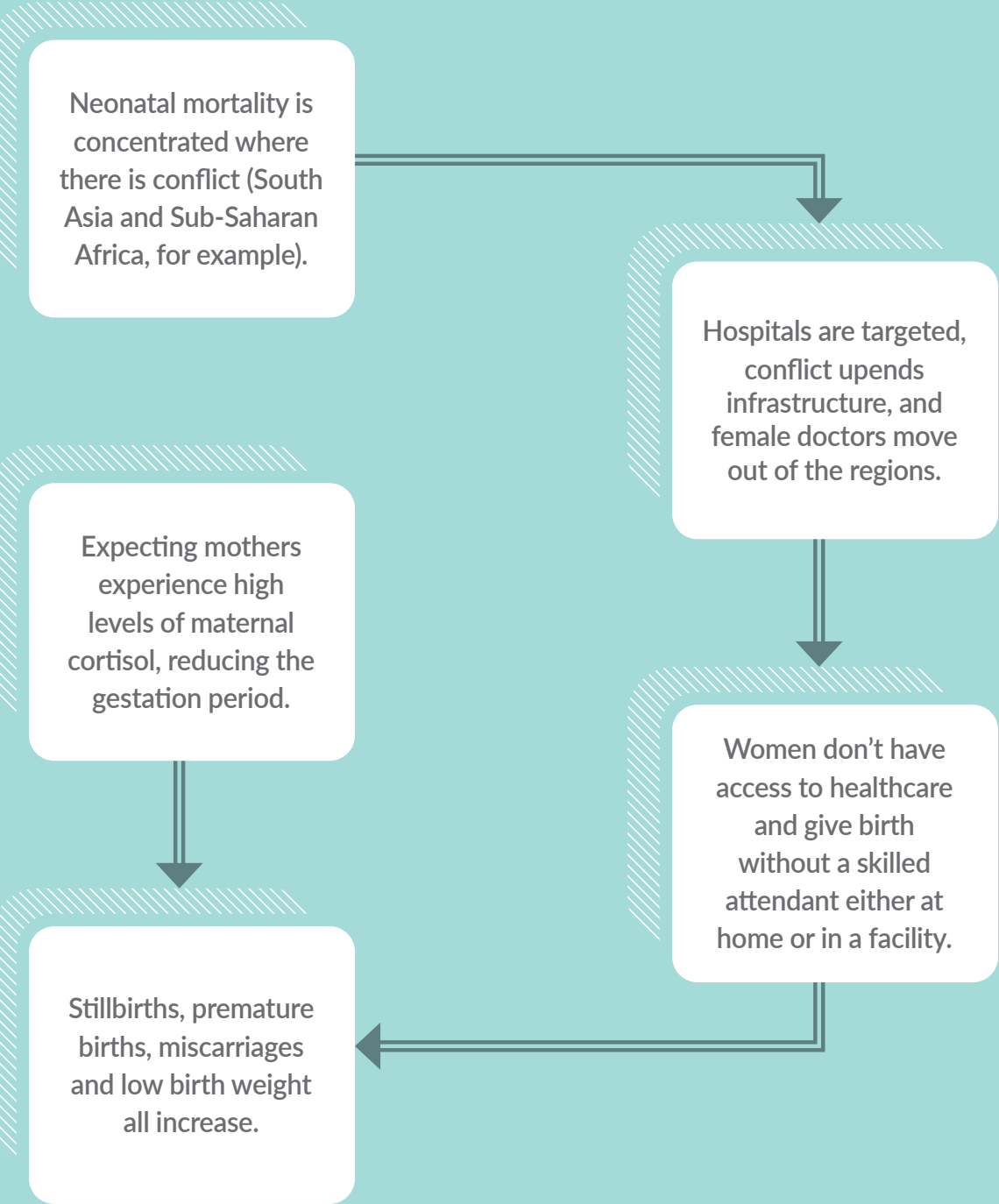
- **80% of newborn deaths** occur from preventable causes—prematurity, infection, and asphyxia.
- **26 million newborns** will die between 2019 and 2030 if nothing changes.
- In 2019, **47% of all under-five deaths** were newborns.
- Of all child deaths under age 15, **2.5 million** occurred within the **first month of life**.
- **61% of newborn deaths** are due to poor quality of care.

There are high neonatal mortality rates in high-conflict areas.

This means that many babies born in war zones die within the first 28 days of life. **Why does this happen?**



BirthAid in Afghanistan and Syria

Afghanistan and Syria have experienced ongoing conflict for years. Both countries are also home to some of the highest neonatal mortality rates in the world. War has upended healthcare systems and infrastructure. Countless doctors and healthcare workers left because of ongoing security concerns. Consequently, pregnant women and newborn babies have little to no access to healthcare. Many women give birth at home, away from a skilled birth attendant, which significantly increases the chances of complications. Babies born to mothers experiencing high-stress levels will be low in birth weight or are born early. These conditions are highly treatable but can be fatal if there is no intervention. Sadly, many babies in these countries die within the first month of life.



We provide a culturally appropriate solution to high neonatal mortality rates.

What We Provide:

In Afghanistan, we use a community-based model to overcome the obstacles created by conflict. We train community leaders in safe birthing skills to then utilize in their communities. These community leaders go through an entire birth-training course that addresses maternal and neonatal health before, during and after birth. They learn essential information that will ultimately save babies' lives.

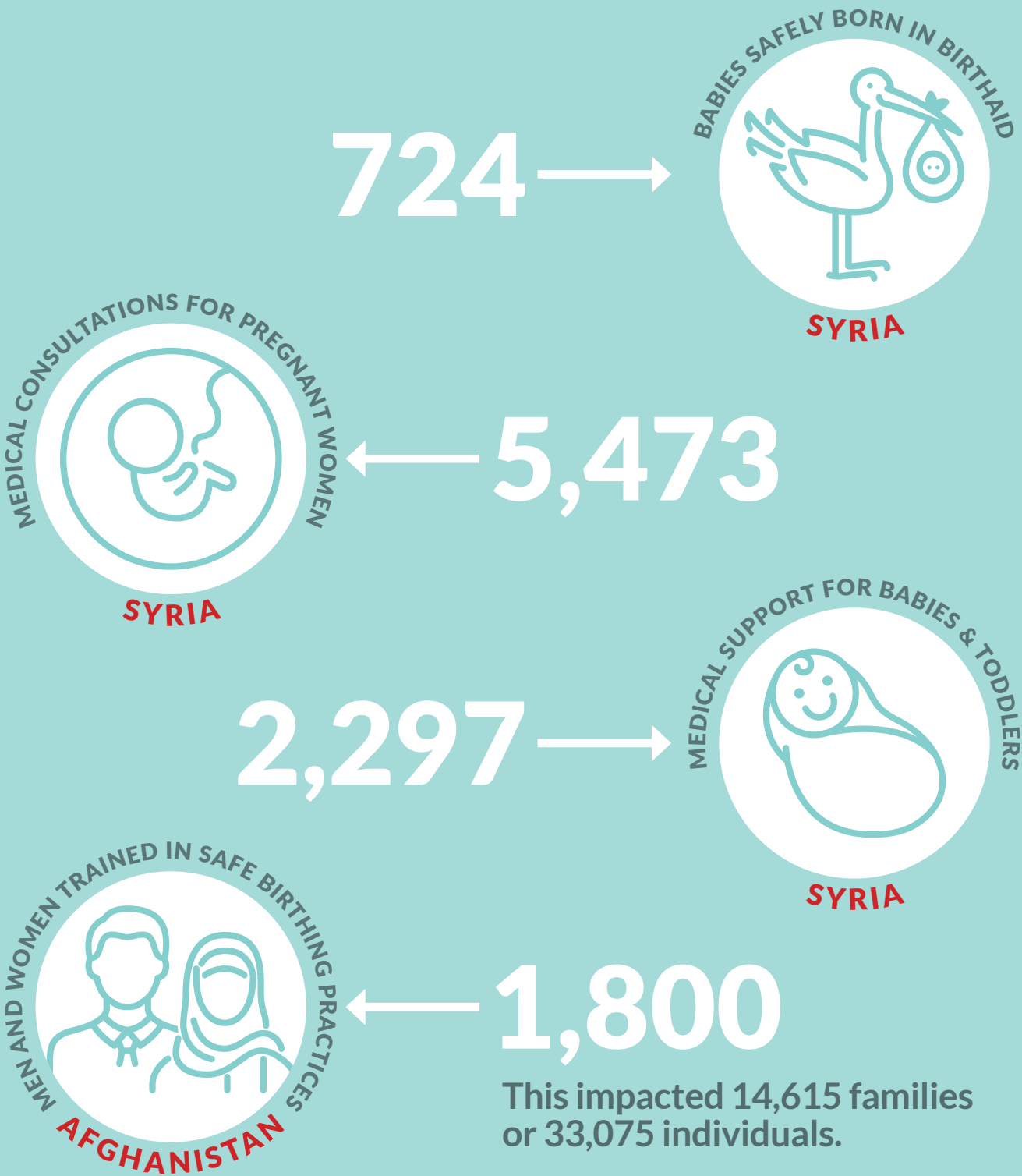


Mothers now have hope for their babies' futures!

In Syria, we provide nurses, doctors, midwives and obstetricians in critical locations where conflict remains active. In these areas, ongoing conflict means that very few women have access to a skilled birth attendant.

PROGRAM IMPACT



GHARAM'S STORY:

Gharam is a mother of five, living in Syria. She and her family are no strangers to war, having survived years of violence, scarcity and famine during the conflict there. Gharam is raising her children alone since her husband was recruited to the army during the war and rarely returns home. During the peak of violence, Gharam and her babies were locked inside their neighbor's underground living space for months at a time to survive. Her babies were starving, and they had a complete lack of medical care.

However, you stepped in and changed their story. Gharam and her babies are now receiving the care and support they need to heal and thrive. Her youngest baby was safely born at our BirthAid Clinic last year, and she now has another baby on the way! She's so excited that she can deliver her newest baby in the safety and security of the clinic you have supplied with obstetricians, pediatricians, nurses, midwives and neonatal care.

After the severe trauma and distress this family has encountered, they now have a glimpse of hope because of your generosity and compassion. Thank you.

Malnutrition Feeding: Babies survive!



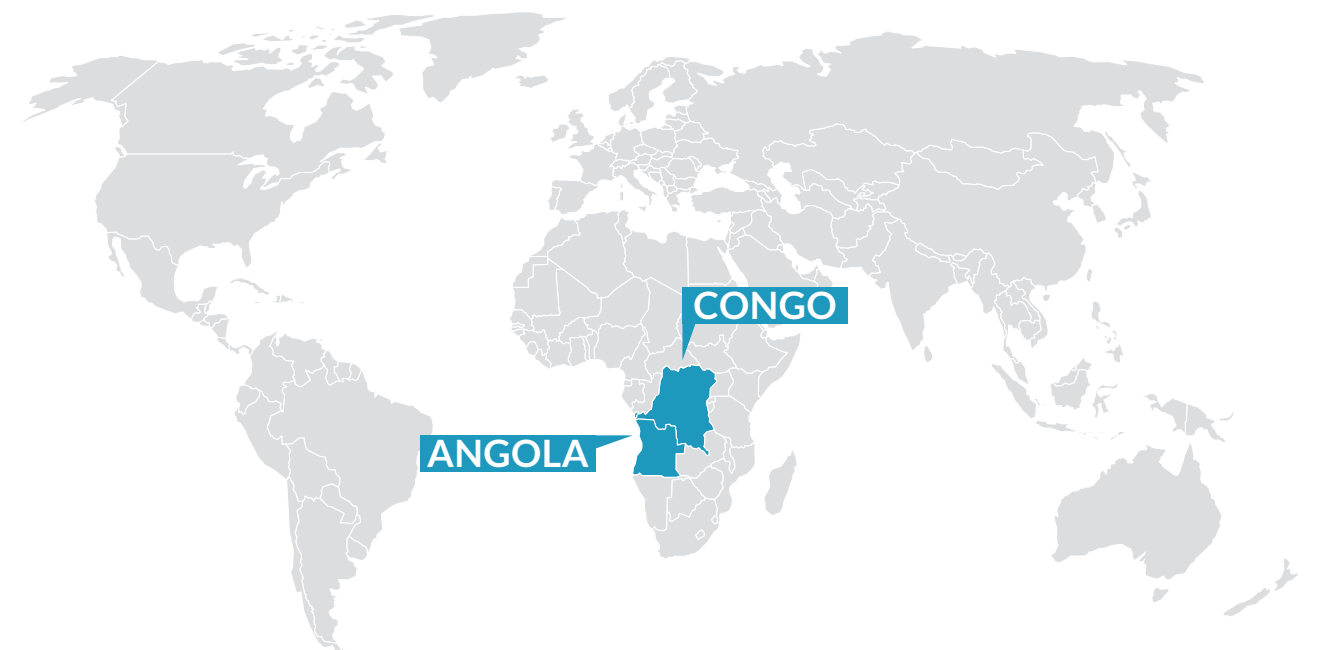
We administer therapeutic milk to babies with Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) and who are at risk of starvation.

Saving Babies Suffering from Severe Acute Malnutrition

- **What is SAM?** Very low weight for height (measured by the arm circumference), evidenced by edema (protruding tummy) or severe wasting (skeletal appearance).
- **What causes SAM?** A relatively short duration of nutritional deficiency often complicated by infective illness.
- **Do babies die from SAM?** If left untreated, SAM is extremely fatal.

The Congo has one of the world's highest infant mortality rates.

Helping Babies Grow in Angola and the DRC

A mix of poor weather conditions, weak governance and conflict have left Angola and the DRC unable to meet the needs of their most vulnerable populations—babies and toddlers. Both countries have high infant mortality rates, which are often higher in rural or conflict-ridden areas, where access to healthcare is low. Sadly, every year many babies pass away from malnutrition—a very treatable condition when met with the right interventions.

What We Provide:



These therapeutic milk packets help children like Zeferina recover from life-threatening malnutrition.

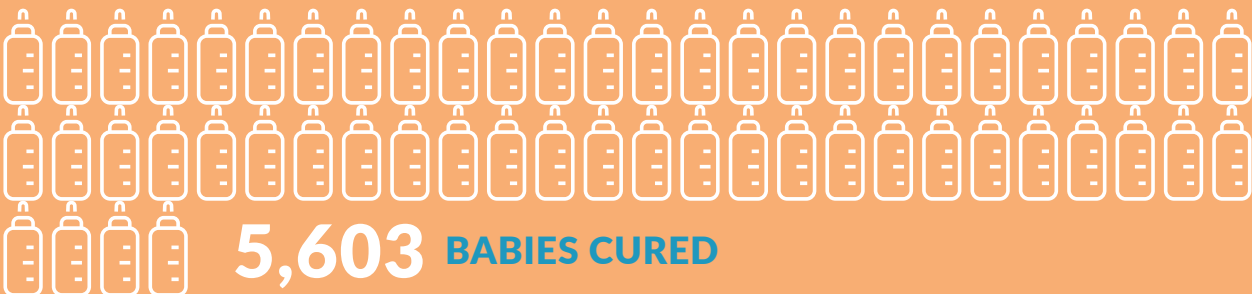
We provide therapeutic milk (F75 and F100) for six clinics in Angola to support an estimated 10,000 babies and toddlers. Scientists specially formulate this therapeutic milk to treat SAM. Once a baby starts therapeutic foods, it takes between four to six weeks to reach a full recovery. Since its inception in 2012, this program has helped keep tens of thousands of babies from dying.

In the DRC, we provide an outpatient and inpatient therapeutic feeding program. Because of the difficulty of getting goods into Congo, our on-the-ground team can use local food to make a fortified porridge similar to the lab-developed F75 and F100 formulas. This “homemade” porridge is a revolutionary solution that breaks through the obstacles and challenges of getting vital services to these precious babies and has saved hundreds of lives.

ZEFERINA'S STORY:

Zeferina is two years old and lives in Angola. When we met her, she experienced persistent body pain, fevers and fatigue that kept her sleeping most of the time. Her parents took her to the nearest medical clinic where the doctors gave her medication to relieve her symptoms and sent her home. Her parents soon realized this was not a permanent fix and went back to the hospital. Doctors misdiagnosed her twice, and her symptoms grew worse each day.

Fortunately, someone who had been to our clinic in the past informed Zeferina's parents that these were symptoms of SAM and could only be treated at our Malnutrition Clinic.

After just two weeks of drinking our therapeutic milk, Zeferina experienced drastic physical improvement. She fully recovered and was successfully discharged. Her mother told us, *"I lack words to correctly express my gratitude for all the support that you gave to us with the free milk!"* The disease is fatal, but the solution is simple. Thank you for giving Zeferina a second chance at life.

Saving Moses will provide lifesaving support for babies and toddlers in Venezuela, where constant insecurity is causing one of the worst humanitarian disasters of all time. Many are left without the proper nutrients and are at risk of malnutrition. We will provide preventative treatments and nutritional supplements.

We provide loving shelter and care for the babies of sex workers at night when they are most vulnerable to abuse, neglect and exploitation.

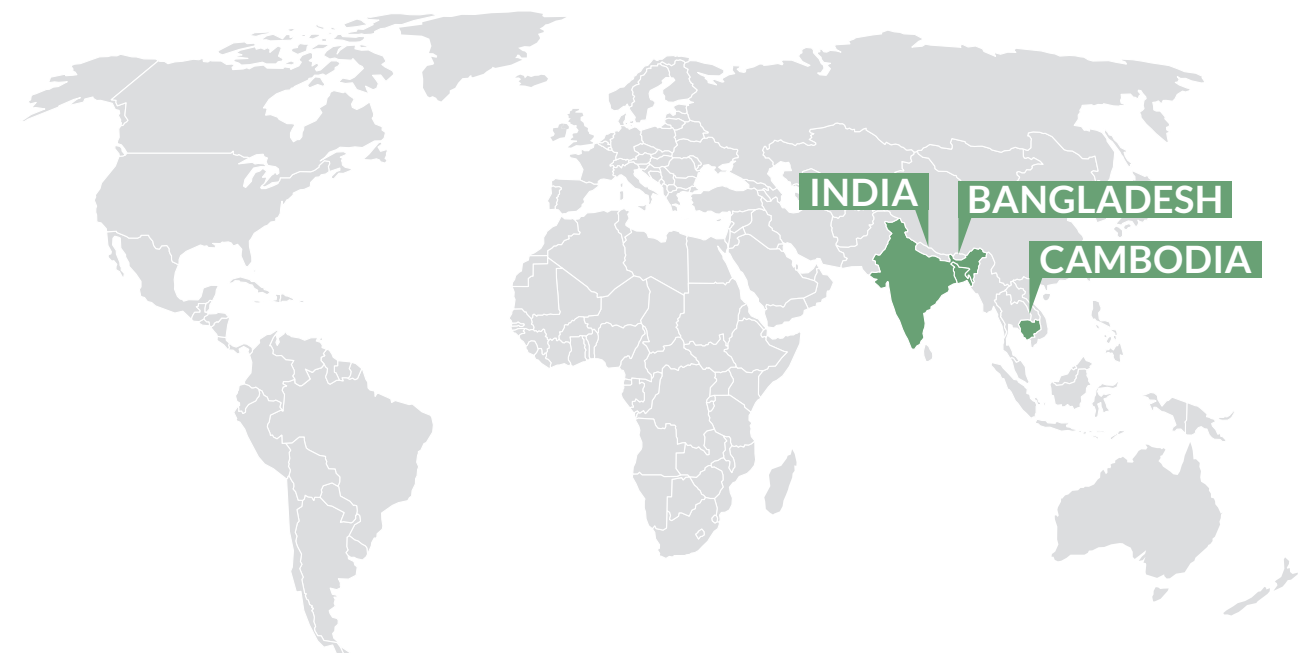
Giving Babies and Toddlers a Safe Place to Sleep

For babies growing up in the sex industry, a life of abuse and neglect is often all they know.

Young toddlers wander the streets while their mothers work. Babies are left under a bed while their mothers service clients. Some mothers tie ropes to their children to prevent them from being abducted. This is a life that no baby or toddler should experience. Sadly, this is the reality for babies and toddlers worldwide who are growing up in the sex industry in low-to-middle-income countries. That is why we need NightCare.

NightCare in Bangladesh, Cambodia and India



NightCare provides a safe and loving environment for children otherwise left in unsafe places.

While the context looks different for each country, they all share a common thread—babies and toddlers are growing up in the sex industry. They are exposed to a life of sex work, which often includes harmful abuse. Many babies who have made it to our centers bear the scars of what their mothers’ clients have done to their fragile, vulnerable bodies. Some have witnessed horrific sexual acts at a tender age. Some have no supervision during the dangerous night hours and are left wandering alone.

Often governments in these regions lack the desire or ability to provide the social services needed to intervene on these babies’ behalf. So they are helpless—trapped in a life they did not choose—one of constant survival and danger. With this apparent gap in care of these precious little ones—we step in with NightCare.

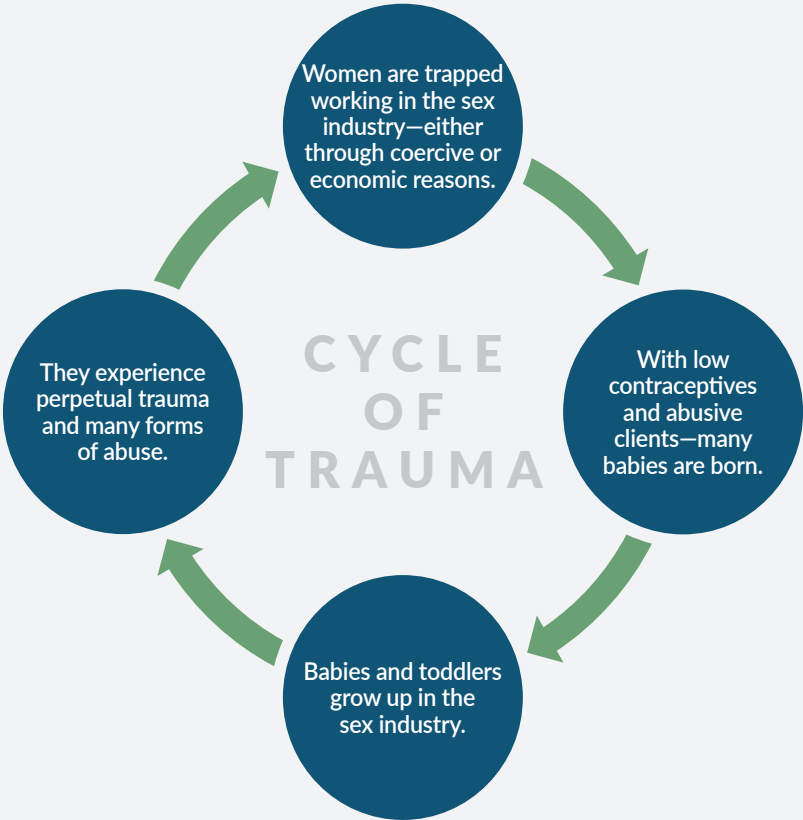
We have five centers in Cambodia, two centers in Bangladesh and one center in India, where we provide loving shelter and care for babies and toddlers.

The NightCare program prevents further abuse by giving babies and toddlers a safe place to sleep away from the dangers of the sex industry. It helps heal babies and toddlers from past abuse by providing consistent caregivers, trauma-informed care and a nurturing environment. It helps babies and toddlers thrive by ensuring nutritious meals, a time for play, and age-appropriate lessons. Finally, it helps prepare children for the future by training them on abuse prevention and connecting them with other nonprofits once they “age out” or turn six years old.

CHANLINA'S STORY:

Chanlina is two years old, and her mother is a sex worker. Before NightCare, her mother would take Chanlina to work with her each night. Chanlina would sleep on a couch directly outside the brothel room where her mother worked. She was exposed to the sex industry every night because her mother had nowhere else to take her. What could she do?

Then this precious mother learned about NightCare. At first, she was apprehensive about leaving Chanlina with people she did not know. She worried for her daughter's safety. But then, in her own words, "The moment I saw how the NightCare staff interacted with the other kids, my doubt faded away."

After being in NightCare, Chanlina has been loved, cared for, protected, valued and nurtured by our staff. She also gets to make new friends and just be a kid. Her mother says she cannot wait to tell all her friends about NightCare.

Matt will also be instrumental in helping NightCare expand in key areas.

COVID-19 Response



The COVID-19 pandemic rocked the world. As cases around the world grew, governments mandated lockdowns. While this created an obstacle for our programs and ground teams, we pivoted to address the emerging needs of babies and toddlers.

- **In our NightCare countries,** we provided over 1,000 CareBoxes full of essentials like food, medicine and soap to keep our babies healthy and safe. We also kept in contact with the mothers, maintaining the trusting relationship we'd already built, so they would resume bringing their babies once our centers reopened.
- **In Angola,** we provided take-home rations to prevent the potential of babies suffering from malnutrition during mandated lockdowns.
- **In Iraq,** we provided needed baby essentials for families in refugee camps.



Ary says: "Thank you, ***Saving Moses***, for providing free food, milk, diapers, vitamins, soap, shampoo and other supplies to my baby during this time of desperate need. Because of the impact of COVID-19, I have no work and no money to buy food for my baby. Without this organization, I don't know what or where I would be now."

Letter from the Board President

Last year will long be remembered for the COVID-19 pandemic and the devastating impact it has had on the world. *Saving Moses* works tirelessly to save babies in far-flung places, serving those in desperate need. 2020 could easily have become a year to just ride the pandemic out.

But that is not what happened with *Saving Moses*! It has been a great inspiration to see how incredibly creative *Saving Moses* leadership and staff have been, as have our colleagues in other countries. Together, they have faced up to the challenge and, more importantly, have thrived in the midst of it.

International travel restrictions in 2020 prohibited the *Saving Moses* leadership and home office staff from visiting our service programs in other countries. The home office staff are maintaining regular communication with their colleagues overseas. Staying current on what is happening in these other countries is critical to decision-making about how best to proceed in 2021. Some of our service program sites were subject to country-based lockdowns or closures during 2020. When this occurred, resources were redirected to programs within *Saving Moses* that were still able to provide services and even expand. Our program metrics continued to show strong outcomes for children participating whenever programs were in place. One very positive outcome for the overall program of *Saving Moses* is that, despite the pandemic, our fundraising continued to show solid growth.

There are many children throughout the world in need of the programs and opportunities *Saving Moses* provides. We remain hopeful that 2021 will allow all our programs to quickly reach pre-2020 service levels as well as promoting expansion. And even as we look forward with the programs we have, we continue to look for new partnerships and opportunities to expand our efforts to other countries and help more babies survive and thrive.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I want to express sincere thanks to each of you who support our efforts through sacrificial giving, volunteerism, encouragement, staffing and spreading the word about what is happening at *Saving Moses*. And finally, we want to express our sincere appreciation and support for all our program leaders and workers in other countries. We know you have struggled mightily during 2020. We love each of you for your commitment to saving lives, meeting daily needs and working toward brighter futures for today's babies.



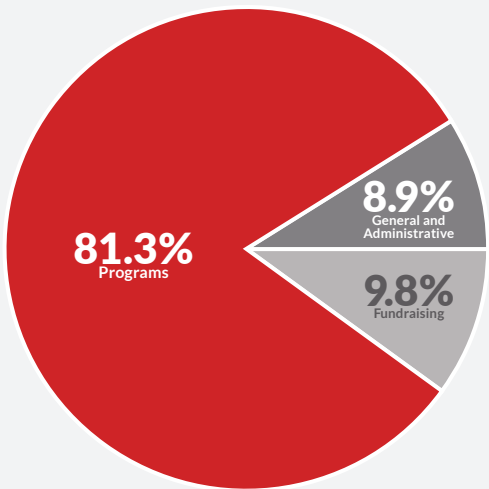

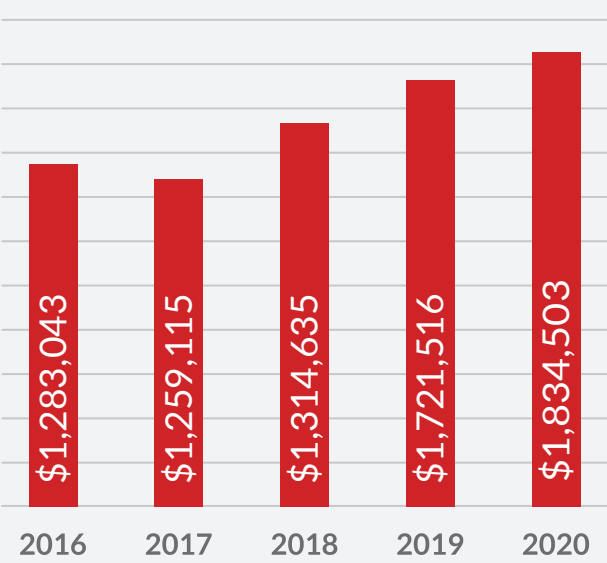
