Who We Are: We save babies every day.

Our Mission:

Saving Moses is a global humanitarian organization saving babies (5 & under) every day by meeting the most urgent and intense survival needs where help is least available.

Our Vision:

To establish lifesaving programs in areas where the infant and neonatal mortality rates are the highest in the world and to protect babies most at risk to the sex industry in low-income countries.

BirthAid: Babies are born safely!



What We Do:

We provide community-based education and skilled birth attendants in areas where the neonatal mortality rate is high due to lack of access to lifesaving services or knowledge of safe-birth information.

Where:

Afghanistan, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), and, starting in April of 2024, a new BirthAid program in Angola

Why:

Rural and war-torn areas of Sub-Saharan Africa and the Middle East frequently experience some of the highest neonatal mortality (death occurring before 28 days of age) rates globally. BirthAid focuses on addressing two main causes of neonatal mortality: insufficient birth education and limited access to healthcare.

For expectant mothers residing in remote regions, long distances and cultural traditions often hinder them from accessing necessary medical care and birth education, which are essential for a smooth pregnancy, safe delivery, and proper understanding of newborn care.

Furthermore, during times of war, medical facilities frequently become prime targets, drastically reducing the availability of essential medical care that many mothers and newborns need to survive.

What Help Looks Like:

- Education about safe childbirth and baby-care practices
- Assistance from trained birth attendants during childbirth
- Pediatric check-ups for babies and toddlers, promoting a healthy start to life
- Prenatal check-ups for expectant mothers, facilitating a safer, easier birth
- Guidance on breastfeeding, supporting infant health and development
- A newly built Antenatal Ward in the DRC for mothers who have high-risk pregnancies

I started BirthAid because we realized babies are the most frail and vulnerable the first 28 days of their lives.

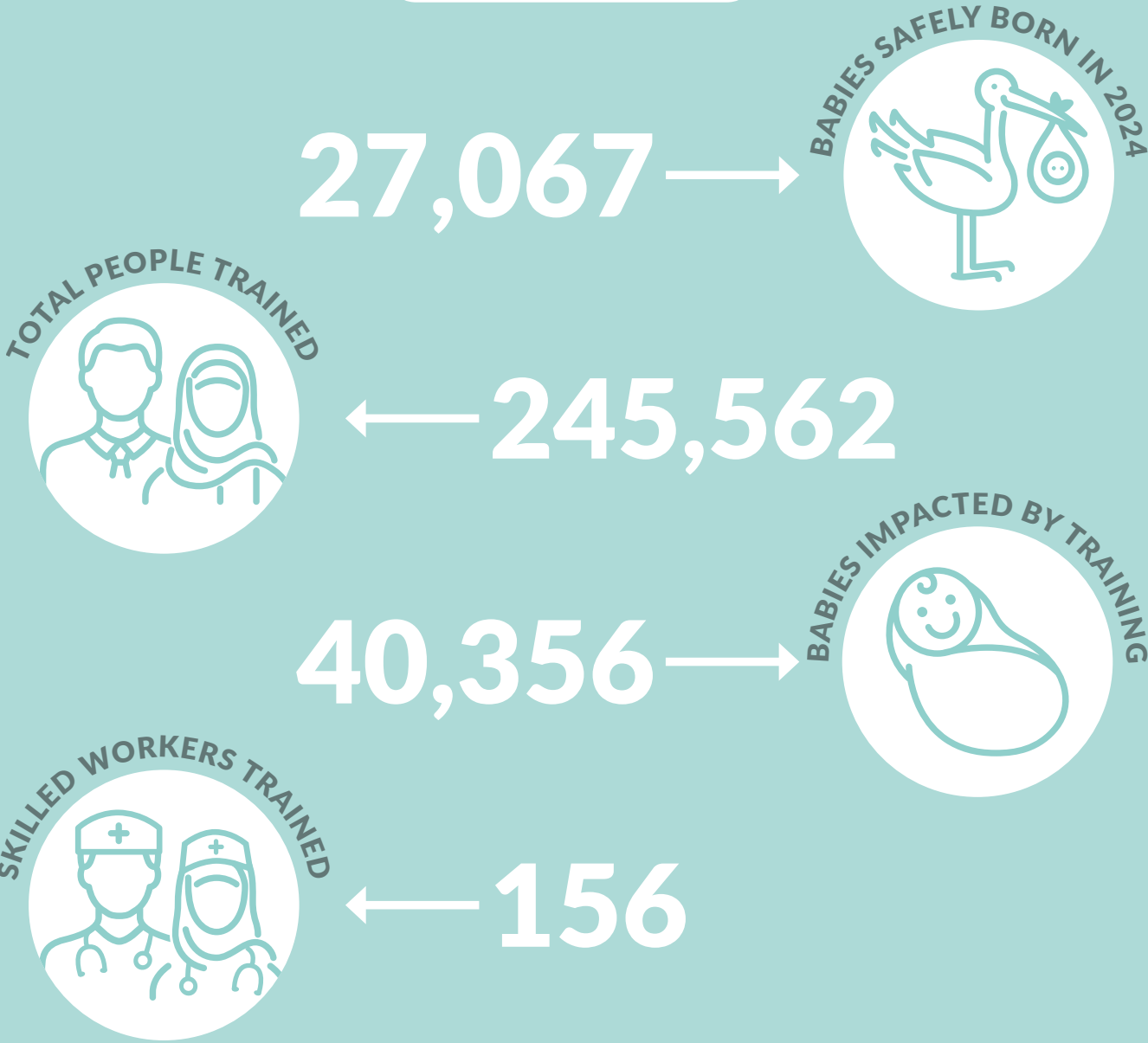

REBECCA'S STORY:

Rebecca was 22 years old and pregnant with her second baby. We met her in the room where pregnant mothers wait in the early stages of labor or are being prepped for a C-section. She weighed only 90 pounds, including her baby! She was scheduled for a C-section.

Rebecca had been referred from one of the rural clinics as a high-risk pregnancy and delivery.

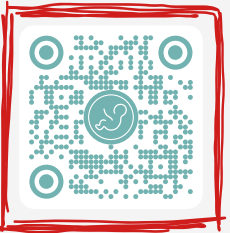
Our videographer was asked to discreetly document the C-section. Dr. Lindsay, our pediatrician, was hosting our videographer in the surgery suite while they were preparing Rebecca for her C-section. As they were doing that preparation, Rebecca's eyes rolled back in her head, and she crashed!

The team quickly revived Rebecca with CPR to restart her heart. Immediately following that the team realized the baby inside her was in duress. They did a rapid C-section to safely get the baby out. Then they had to do CPR on the baby because the baby's heart had also stopped.

Both Rebecca and her baby survived because faithful donors like you helped provide an Antenatal Clinic in the DRC. Thank you!

Malnutrition Feeding: Babies survive!



What We Do

Saving Moses administers specially formulated therapeutic milk to help starving babies and toddlers recover from Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM).

Where

Angola and the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC)

Why

In 2022, Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) continued across the DRC and Angola, impacting babies and toddlers. In Angola, a 2023 UNICEF report showed “[a] high rate of severe acute malnutrition, particularly among children under-five . . .”^{*} In the Democratic Republic of the Congo, an estimated 3.3 million children under the age of 5 suffered from acute malnutrition in 2021, including at least one million with severe acute malnutrition.^{**}

Several factors fueled the continuing crisis, including the COVID-19 pandemic, food insecurity, extreme poverty, ongoing conflicts, the war in Ukraine, and rising temperatures. Afflicted children exhibit swollen abdomens, visible skeletal structures, changes in hair texture and color, labored breathing, and peeling skin. Without swift medical intervention, SAM is fatal.

What Helps Looks Like

- Specially formulated therapeutic milk for starving babies and toddlers
- Four to six weeks of care at *Saving Moses’* Malnutrition Clinics
- Food for mothers, so they will keep their babies enrolled for the entire treatment

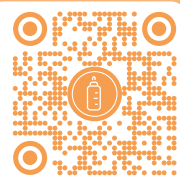

MARTINO'S HOMECOMING!

While visiting a Malnutrition Clinic in Angola, Sarah and the team were able to celebrate with Martino's mother because she was leaving to bring her son home!

When Mom first brought Martino to the clinic, he was suffering from Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM), weighing only 17 lbs. He was in a terrible state, unresponsive, and not drinking water. He couldn't sit up or even roll his body over.

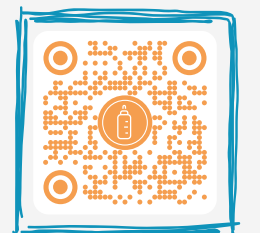
After his first day in the clinic, his condition declined rapidly and the doctor put him on oxygen to assist his body in fighting. Because Martino was on oxygen, the clinic workers gave him therapeutic milk through feeding tubes.

Martino's recovery is remarkable. He now weighs 22 lbs. He is walking and playing with his brother. He's ready to go home and become a lively member of his family. And not only that—going through this horrible experience has inspired Martino's mother to become a part of our rural community program. She wants to share with her village what she learned about spotting the signs of SAM using our armbands!

This is a tremendous accomplishment from our three-pronged Malnutrition Feeding program. We feed the baby or toddler therapeutic milk, we feed the mother to ensure she can stay with her baby at the clinic until her baby is fully recovered, and we bring preventative training out to the rural villages.

NightCare: Babies are protected and loved!



What We Do

NightCare ensures safety and security overnight for babies and toddlers of sex workers. We provide nutritious meals, clean clothes, age-appropriate toys, soft sleeping pallets, and nurturing care from loving nannies.

Where

Cambodia, Bangladesh, and India

Why

In Southeast Asia's sex industry, workers' precious babies and toddlers face horrors that no child should ever experience. Without proper care, some babies are abducted, abused, or exploited. Some are even chained to beds as their mothers work nearby. Their innocent lives urgently need protection and care. The emotional damage to these babies and toddlers is incalculable. No other program addresses the needs of little ones trapped in this world of violence, abuse, and fear. We believe that unconditional love is the most powerful tool at our disposal to help break the cycle of trauma in the lives of these babies and toddlers.

What Helps Looks Like

- Secure NightCare Centers where babies can sleep peacefully and safely
- Healthy, satisfying meals for the little ones staying in our NightCare Centers
- Clean clothes the babies and toddlers can take home, promoting healthier immune systems
- Playtime with toddlers (many of whom have been severely traumatized), giving them the chance to be children
- A staff of nannies who are trained, supportive, and empathetic

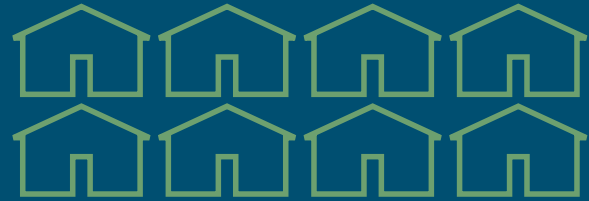
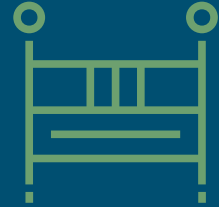
We take a Healing-From-Trauma based approach to all of the toddlers and babies in our NightCare. Our goal is to break the cycle of trauma in their lives.

FROM NIGHTMARES TO NIGHTCARE

Meet Chenda*. She is 5 years old. Before NightCare, when she slept at home every night, she would have horrible nightmares. Before her mother, Panha*, knew about NightCare, the situation with her daughter was very difficult to manage. If Panha didn't work, she couldn't provide for her baby girl. Chenda wouldn't listen; she was disobedient and only interested in playing on Panha's phone.

At first, when she learned about NightCare, Panha was worried about leaving her daughter in the care of others. However, she quickly saw that Chenda was excited to go to NightCare and never complained about it. She's told her mother that the nannies at NightCare love her very much! They feed her, bath her, and play with her every time she visits. This reassured Panha and has helped ease the burden of trying to raise her daughter in a dangerous environment.

Now Chenda has learned how to take a shower by herself and wash her own hair. She's learned chores like picking up her sleep mat and helping the nannies to clean up. This has impressed Panha, whose child is not only growing bigger and healthier, but is also learning manners and a respectful demeanor. Even her skin is healthier looking because of the nutritious food provided at the center. Chenda is turning into a smart and happy little girl! Panha is amazed at these changes in her daughter and incredibly grateful to NightCare and the nannies who work at the center.

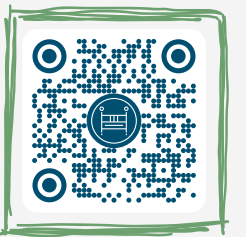

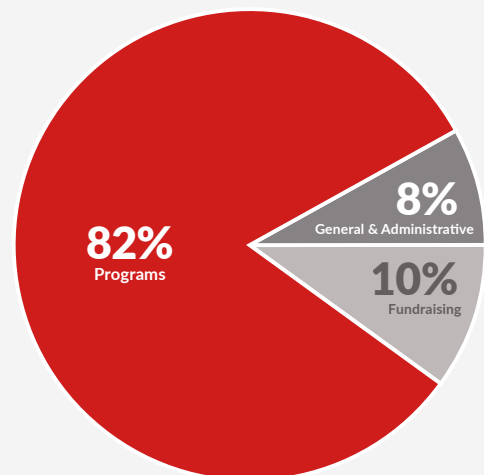

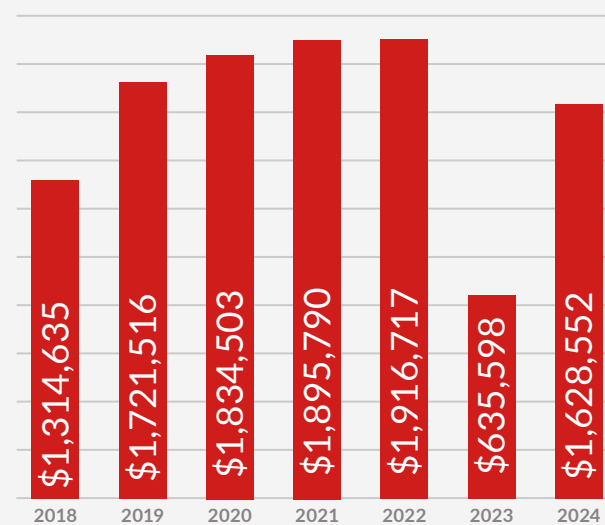
